DISTRICT MANAGER'S REPORT

New benches and garbage cans that were approved at the August Board meeting have been ordered. Confirmed with EBMUD that the drainpipe in the front northwest corner of the Lafayette Cemetery has been removed. Ordered a Bouncie Tracker for the District truck. The Bouncie will track movements, speed, hard braking, service, etc with real time updates. During the cold snap a Monterey pine tree cracked through its trunk and for safety purposes had to be removed immediately. I have again contacted Lafayette Pointe Condos Manager Marissa Hunter at Common Interests Management, regarding splitting the costs for much needed care of the Eucalyptus trees on their property. She replied with, "The Board discussed this issue at the last meeting and will not share the cost of trimming the trees as they are not on the Association's property." Met with Gordon Schell at Schell & Martin Surveyors, regarding a topography of the Lafayette Cemetery's eastern property line, which his firm will perform. Both Mai and I will attend the SDRMA sponsored Safety and Claims Education Day in Sacramento on March 20, 2018.
